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Why Should Engineers Care About Advocacy?

Legislation/Policy Impacts the Profession in Several Ways:

- Personal Professional Licensure
 - > Granted through Article 20 of PA 299 of 1980 (as amended)
 - Rules are promulgated by the State Licensing Board
 - Ensures standard education, experience and testing as well as standard for continued competence
 - > Department oversight of 20,274 licensed professional engineers in Michigan
- Business Compliance
 - Michigan 2/3 rule (Section 339.2010 of PA 299)
 - Services Requiring the Use of Licensed Design Professionals
- Practice Standards
 - Environmental Regulations (Federal/State/Local)
 - Building Codes
 - > Energy Standards
 - ➤ Land Division/Zoning Ordinances

Public Policy

Formed through a course of government action or inaction in response to a public issue – generally address the health, safety and welfare of the public.

Public Policy Formation




Public policy is formed at all levels of government.


It is important to be engaged at all levels in different manners.

- ❖ SB 5286 Flashing Lights on Speed Signs in Construction Zone PA 52 of 2022
- ❖ SB 627/628 Remonumentation Bills PA 81 and PA 82 of 2022
- ❖ SB 642 Qualifications Based Selection passed House and Senate; pocket veto
- ❖ HB 5538 Design/Build for School Construction Stopped at 11th hour from moving out of committee
- ❖ Appropriations/Funding bills for infrastructure
- ❖ PE Administrative Rules Change to Include Ethics CPD requirement

2023-2024 Legislative Concerns

- Infrastructure Appropriations
- ❖ SB 43 Traffic Control Devices passed Senate in House Committee
- ❖ SB 88/89 Clean Water in Schools/Child Care Centers
- ❖ Working on introduction of bill to amend PA 132 of 1970
- ❖ Working on education and reintroduction of QBS bill
- Preparing for potential reintroduction of the School Design/Build bill

- Actively reviewed NSPE Position Statements for relevancy and established timelines for review
- Attended various events regarding topics of importance to NSPE members



2023-2024 Federal Advocacy Initiatives

- Supporting S. 722 and H.R. 1477 which allows changes in 529 account spending
- Advocating for continued funding at \$200 M for FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities Program
- Advocating for continued funding at \$100M for FEMA capitalization grants
- Actively reviewing NSPE Position Statements for relevancy
- Developing position paper on Artificial Intelligence and it's potential impact on public health, safety and welfare
- State Advocacy Subcommittee continuing work to better align resources and identify advocacy gaps
